CV & COVER LETTER

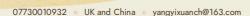
I have been learning about Chinese traditional cultures from a young age, including ethnic costumes, historical tales, classic music, etc. Also, I enjoyed reading different genres of literature, such as history, the arts, and detective and watching the dramas and TV shows adapted and filmed from them. I have always fantasised about bringing the stories in the books to the big screen. Then, a random chance brought me to the field of theatre costume design, and I found that it was the perfect fit for me, as it blends my previous passions and endeavours and provides me with the possibility of fulfilling my long-held aspiration. Therefore, I determinedly chose to enter the Beijing Institute of Fashion Technology to learn fundamental theories and skills related to theatre performance and costume design. As I found early on the fact that musical theatre is not a widely popular form of entertainment in China due to the extensive range of local theatre forms, after completing the first two-year of fundamental courses, I went to the UK, one of the nations with the longest history of theatre performance, to continue my undergraduate studies and currently, I'm a junior in the Design for Stage and Screen (Costume Design and Construction) programme at Nottingham Trent University.

Over the past three years, I have studied background research, academic writing, theatre costume design and production, computer-aided tools, and garment sketching and have become proficient in production procedures, including pattern-making, sewing machine operation, hand sewing and draping. In addition, I have actively participated in a large number of professional practices, completed several stage art and costume production projects, and interned at Nottingham University Lakeside Art in a traditional Chinese storytelling children's theatre production this year, where I worked as a costume design assistant, expanding my design thinking and gaining more real-world design experience. My creative design projects draw inspiration from traditional Chinese culture and stories, combining modern aesthetics with traditional arts to create innovative design concepts and re-creating traditional stories into theatre productions suitable for modern aesthetics. Beyond my dedication to theoretical knowledge and practical skills, my optimistic attitude allowed me to quickly adapt to my study and life abroad, enhancing my adaptability and socialisation. Working with peers from different cultural backgrounds has honed my cross-cultural communication skills. I also collaborated on design projects with practitioners from performance design and fashion management in this summer's design camp, where I coordinated the plans and personnel in the entire design project and increased my teamwork and theatre design skills.

The direction of my future research is the contemporary expression of traditional culture. I hope to re-create classic stories, myths, legends, and historical events in traditional Chinese culture and interpret and perform them under the modern aesthetic perspective, and at the same time, adapt and modernise traditional Chinese art forms such as Peking Opera, acrobatics, and dance, etc. Through innovations in performance form, stage design, and plot setting, traditional arts will be more in line with modern audiences' appreciation while retaining their unique charms. To achieve this goal, I aspire to join your renowned MA Costume programme, as its teaching content and objectives of combining traditional and historic costumes with modern techniques and aesthetics to perpetuate traditional elements and revitalise cultures closely align with my research direction. It will provide more practical opportunities for me to better realise my design ideas, combining design with practical production, empower me to better understand the feasibility and practical application of my designs to deliver more creative ideas on the modern stage and screen and, most importantly, develop my all-round skills to be a professional and independent designer. Upon graduation, I plan to return to my home country to contribute to the development of the theatre and performance industry.

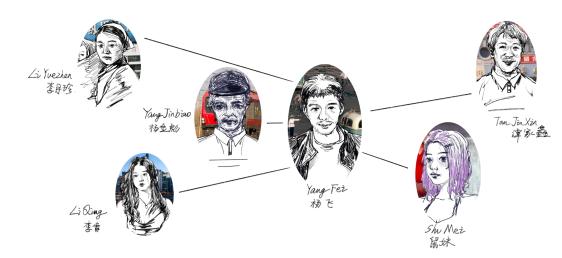

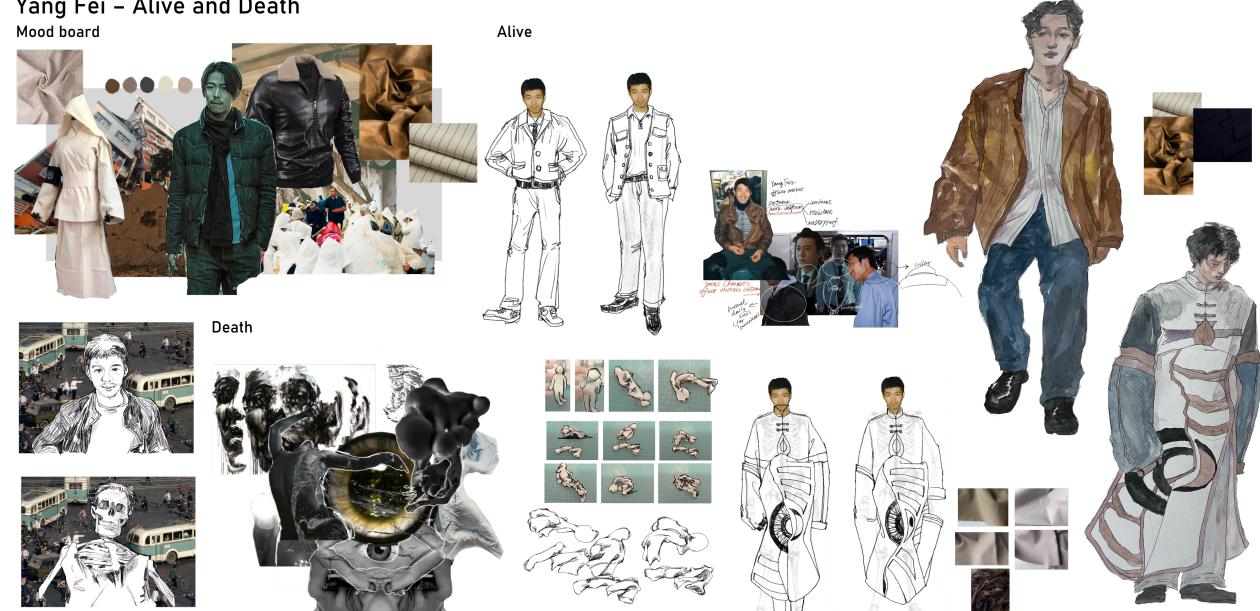

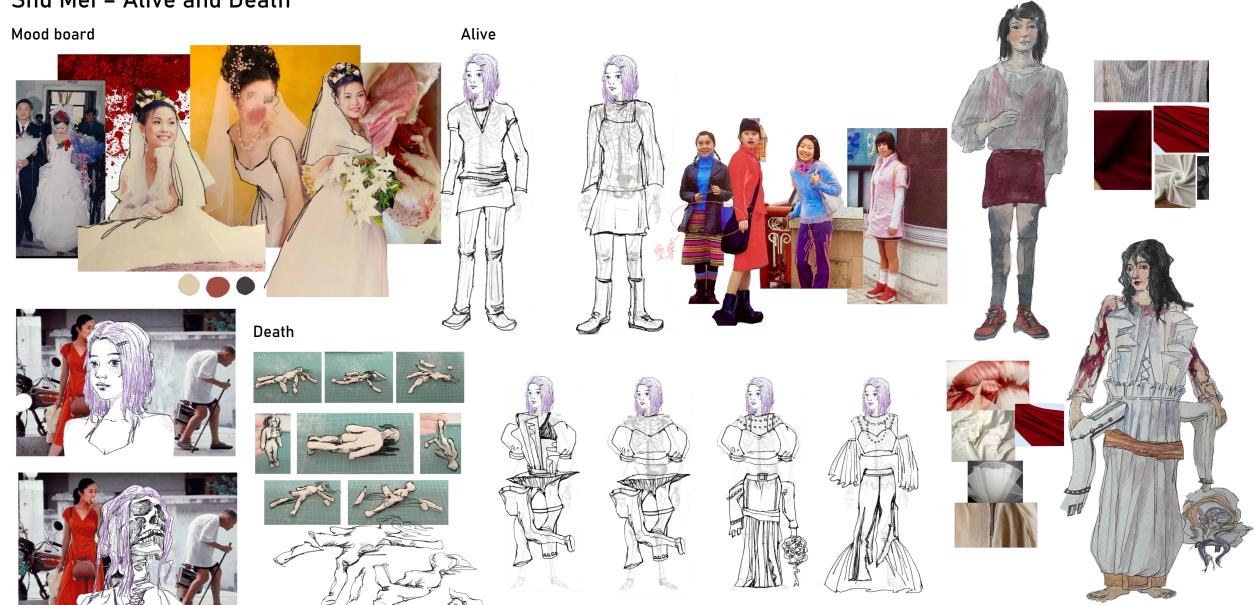


Yang Fei – Alive and Death



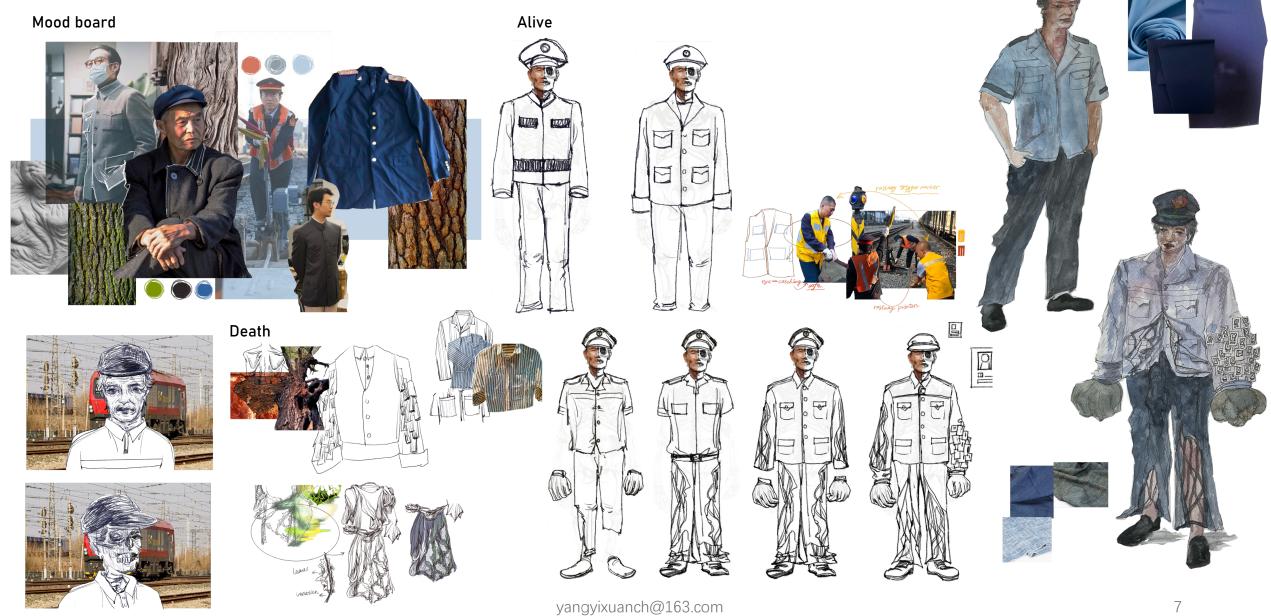

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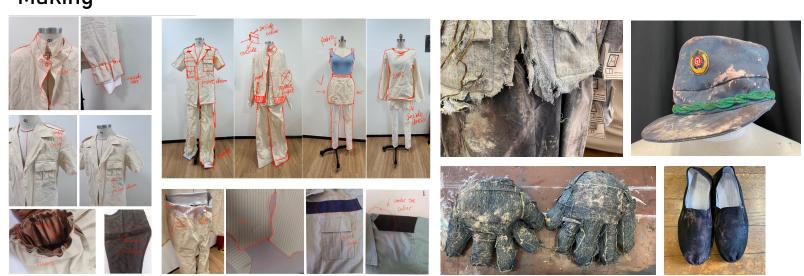

Anna May Wong's Whole Life

Wong Liu Tsong (January 3, 1905 - February 3, 1961), known professionally as Anna May Wong, was an American actress, considered the first Chinese-American movie star in Hollywood, as well as the first Chinese-American actress to gain international recognition. Her varied career spanned silent film, sound film, television, stage, and radio.

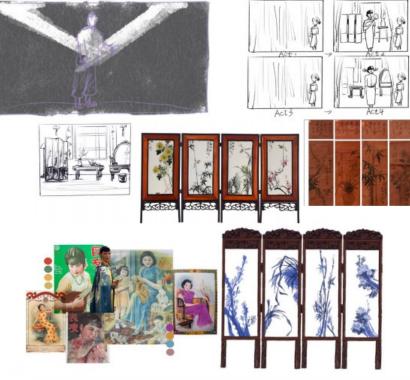
4.1937: Anna May Wong back to China and looked for her roots

Butterfly 1921-1927

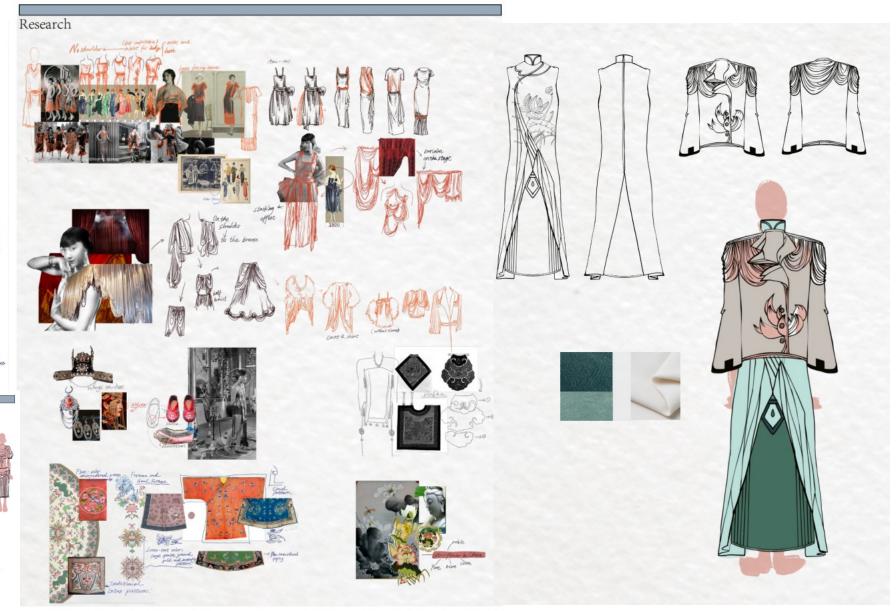

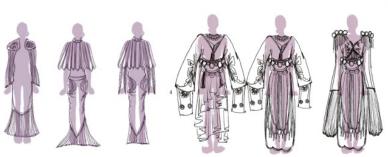


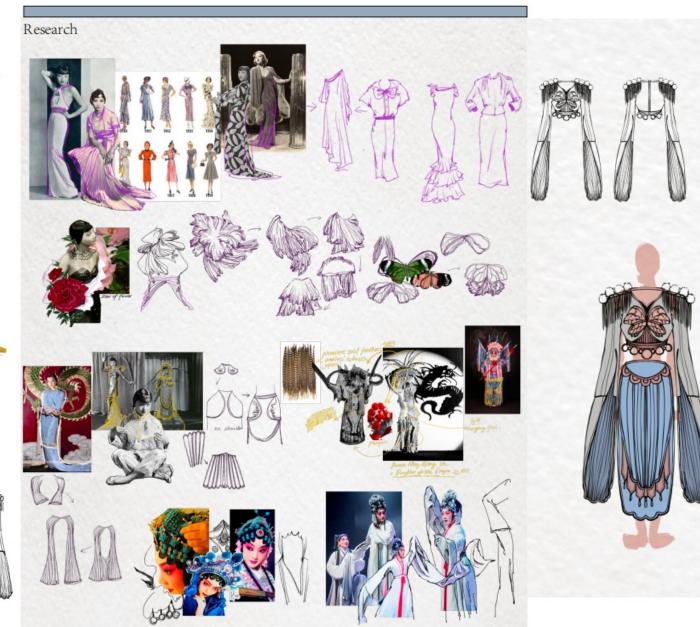
The Glory Days 1930-1936s

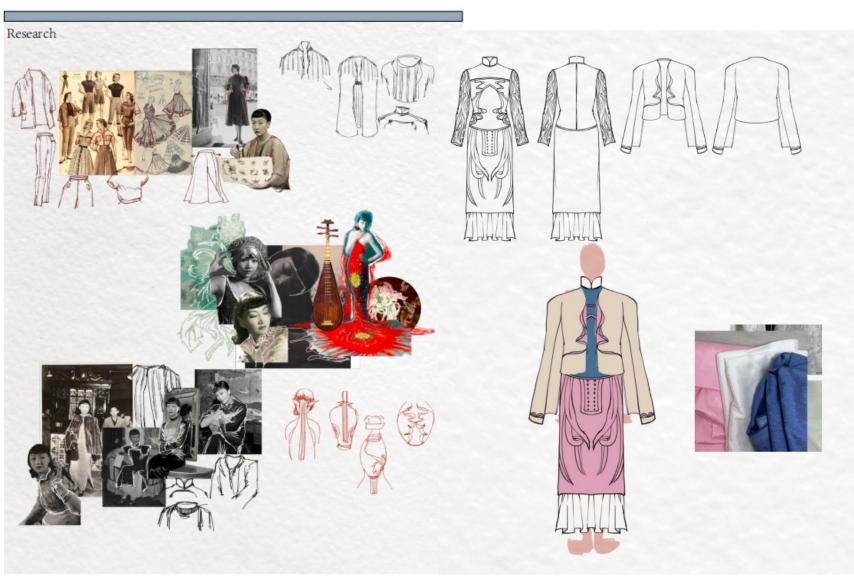


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Imagined period: back to young girl's dream 1950-1961

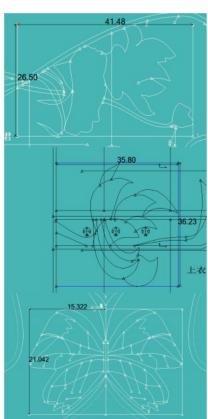

Placement at Lakeside Art



2023 Placement in Traditional Chinese Storytelling at Lakeside Arts Theatre, Nottingham, working as an Assistant Costume Designer on a project touring a small 2-3 person storytelling show celebrating Chinese myths and legends for the Chinese New Year in 2023, with an approximate performance time of 50 minutes. The storytelling theatre tells some of the extraordinary myths and folktales of East Asian China, including the origin of the moon rabbit, the legend of the dragon, the story of Hou Yi shooting the sum, and the tale of the carp leaping over the Dragon Gate. I participated in this internship with Yunshu Jiang from Theatre Design to complete this project. We used a lot of traditional elements from China and integrated them into a short family drama that is suitable for both young and old. The plot sets the main characters, Robin and Fengfeng, playing and role-playing a number of stories in their home, highlighting through thematic undercurrents that our actions can have positive or negative consequences, and that we all need to make positive of regative consequences, and that we all need to make positive of regative to maintain harmony in the world.

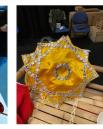
